What is an administrator?

1. The State Administrative Tribunal (SAT) is like an umpire.
2. It helps to settle arguments fairly.
3. It can also decide if someone needs an administrator.
4. An administrator is a person who can make decisions about someone's money and property for a person with a decision-making disability.
5. Decisions about someone's money or property can also be about selling things or paying bills.
6. An administrator does **NOT** make big life decisions.
7. An administrator is often someone's family member or friend.
8. If family or friends are not available, the Public Trustee can be chosen as the administrator.
9. Public Trustee administrators are government workers and their job is to help protect people with decision-making disabilities.
10. Public Trustee administrators can also be called Trust Managers.
11. A Trust Manager working at the Public Trustee can be contacted on 1300 746 212.
