

Lower Gascoyne River Flow Advice N^o 03 2024

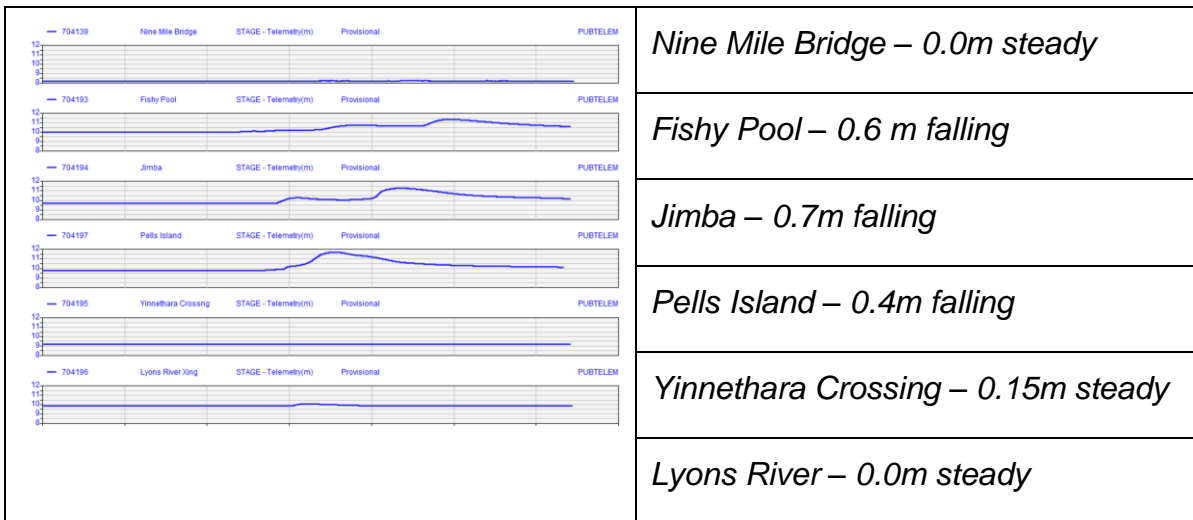
Issued by the Department of Water and Environmental Regulation

1:00 pm Friday 21 June 2024

A river flow in the Gascoyne River is likely to reach Nine Mile Bridge later this afternoon, 21 June 2024, with a further peak on Saturday 22 June 2024, reaching a maximum height of 1.5 meters. Water levels are steady or declining at all other gauging stations within the Gascoyne catchment.

Growers should continue to refer to the Bureau of Meteorology for regular updates and consider removal of their infrastructure from the lower Gascoyne River.

The Department of Water and Environmental Regulation will continue to closely monitor the catchment and river levels. A River Flow Advice update will be provided if conditions change. Gauging Station levels at 11:15 am this morning were:
