NEIGHBOURHOOD WATCH IS ABOUT NEIGHBOURS LOOKING OUT FOR NEIGHBOURS

- A safe, well-connected neighbourhood is one where neighbours know each other, communicate with each other, and are familiar with their local environment.
- Neighbours take the time to look out for, and care about their neighbourhood.
- Report suspicious activity to WA Police Force and share the information with your neighbours.
- Be the eyes and ears of your street and promote good crime prevention habits to reduce the risk of crime.

Get involved

- Get to know your neighbours. Introduce yourselves with our Knock Knock cards, knock on their door or a simple wave and a hello is a good start. Use our resources to introduce the idea of creating a local Neighbourhood Watch network.
- Swap contact information or set up a communication network on a social media platform.
- Follow WA Police Force on social media to stay informed of what is happening in your community.
- Make your home and apartment safer and less inviting for intruders. Refer to the WA Police Force resources for more safety and security advice.

CRIME PREVENTION TIPS

Observe

Get to know your neighbours and stay alert to anything unusual in your community. Neighbourhood Watch encourages you to care for your neighbourhood's safety and be observant of its activities without spying on others.

Acknowledge

- Greeting neighbours and acknowledging strangers can deter potential intruders by showing that you are alert and looking out for one another. This simple act of communication can help reduce the chances of crime in your community.

Report

- Police can only address community issues if they are informed about them. Trust your instincts; if something feels off, it likely is. Report all suspicious and criminal activities to the police.

Share

- Sharing information with the police and your neighbours helps to increase awareness and strengthen community connections.

Prevent

- Practice good crime prevention habits and help your neighbours do the same.
