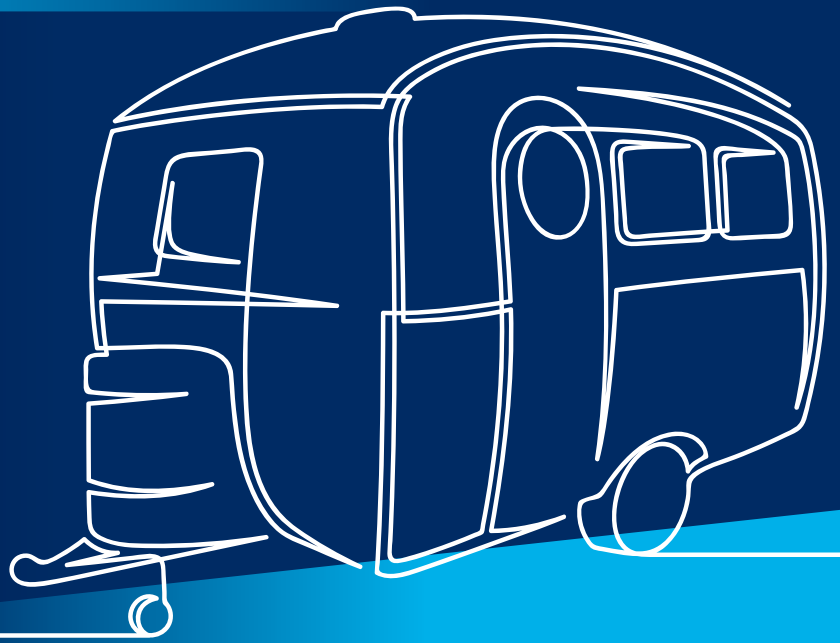

## HOW TO KEEP YOUR BELONGINGS SAFE WHILE ON HOLIDAYS

### Before you leave home

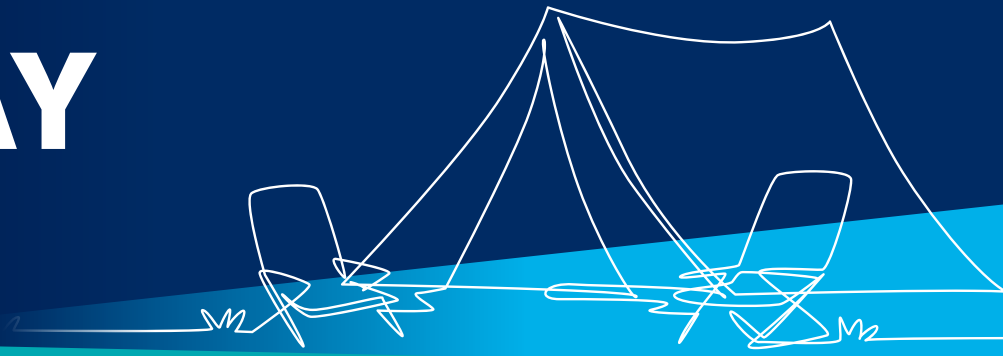
- Ensure all doors and windows are locked, including those for pets, garage, and shed.
- Provide a trusted person with your contact details and spare keys. Put any extra spare keys away and out of sight.
- Store tools securely and out of sight.
- Disconnect your electronic roller door.
- Set timers for lights and electronics.
- Store valuables and important documents in a safe.
- Record serial numbers, make, and model of valuable items. Photograph valuable items like jewelry and antiques.
- Set your alarm system when you leave home.
- If you're leaving your bikes at home, make sure they are properly secured. Register your bicycles on [www.bikelinc.com.au](http://www.bikelinc.com.au).
- Inform your Local council and/or your local Police as to when you will be away.

# HOLIDAY SAFETY.



## Holiday accommodation

- Check the property to ensure it's empty and all doors and windows are secure and lockable.
- Familiarise yourself with the evacuation plan.
- Keep all windows and doors locked, including your vehicle, even when you're inside.
- Avoid leaving items like bikes and sports equipment outside and unsecured.
- Use a safe for valuables if available.
- Use lockers with your own locks in shared areas.

## When you're away from your camp

- Always lock up your caravan.
- Leave lights on when you're out at night.
- Use timers or sensor lights for longer periods.
- Inform the park manager or neighbours if you'll be away and leave your contact info.
- Always lock your car or motorhome when getting fuel or taking a break, and choose well-lit spots for rest stops.

## At the caravan park or camping ground

- Use a hitch or trailer coupling lock, wheel clamp, alarm, steering lock, engine immobiliser, and GPS tracker.
- Get to know your neighbours and watch out for each other's property.
- Keep an eye on your items while unpacking.
- Secure bicycles to your van or park facilities with a D-lock.
- Store boat equipment securely.
- Padlock gas bottles, BBQs, and fridges.
- Remember to bring in your laundry.
- Avoid hiding spare keys around your vehicle or accommodation.
- Report suspicious activity to the Police and the park manager.
