## Background

### **History**

- Proposal and Notice first published in January 2015
- 3 Submissions received
- In March 2015 all Rule Change Proposals "on ice"

### 2017 (now)

- Significant changes to Market Rules since January 2015
- AEMO and RCP Support have assessed impact on proposal
- → New questions for proposed changes



# Alternative Scheduling Day Timeline\*





### STEM Delay - Issues

### 7 January 2017 occurrence

- AEMO discovered error in Ancillary Service information (after opening STEM Submission window)
- → 2 participants unable to make STEM submission
- → AEMO extended STEM Submission window
- → AEMO rectified Ancillary Service information

#### Issues

- Gazettes removed option to delay STEM for problems with Ancillary Service information
- AEMO not allowed to repeat any scheduling steps (e.g. if wrong information is published)

# STEM Delay – Request for Feedback

#### Questions

- Should the provision for AEMO to delay the STEM because of issues with the Ancillary Service data be reinstated?
- In case of any issues with the Scheduling Day steps:
  - Should AEMO be allowed to:
    - repeat relevant Scheduling Day steps to rectify any issues; and
    - delay timelines for such rectification?
  - Should any restrictions or conditions be placed on such repetition and the associated delay?
