Hello,

I would like to add a further submission to my previous submission (4 May). Regarding the Whole of State Option, I believe candidates need to have a high degree of community support before they are entitled to be listed on the ballot paper. This is a reasonable requirement and would reduce the size and complexity of the ballot paper, leading to a more democratic and representative outcome.

There are several ways that this can be achieved;

- 1. Only candidates representing a genuine political party would be considered. These political parties must have over 500 genuine members. Currently the Electoral Commission has a role in assessing political parties, so this requirement is not unusual.
- 2. Candidates must be selected only by a vote of all members of their political party. This can be conducted by the Electoral Commission, or audited before the ballot paper is printed.
- 3. No public funding would be available to political parties who receive less than 3% of the vote.

Additionally, I believe the Expert Panel should consider reforms to the rules for campaign spending and donations. All donations must be transparent, ie details of a donation must be available to the public in real time, preferably by an online process. A cap on campaign spending should be set for each electorate.
