

Western Australian Industry Participation Strategy (WAIPS)



WA Buy Local Policy 2022

Update released in April 2022

- Ensures the ~\$30 billion spent in State Government contracts creates more work for regional WA businesses.
- Regional Price Preferencing an advantage for local businesses when tendering for work in the regions
 - Regional business preference;
 - Regional content preference.
- 43 key Agencies have now signed Implementation Agreements and are applying WA BLP 2022.

Local Content Adviser Great Southern Region

Sumer Addy – Great Southern Development Commission

- Each region has a dedicated Local Content Adviser (LCA), based within the Development Commission.
- Your Great Southern LCA's role is to:
 - Connect Great Southern businesses with capability and grant programs.
 - Liaise with head contractors to encourage opportunities for local sub-contractors.
 - Advocate for Great Southern SMEs in relation to government procurement and help them connect to opportunities.

Local Capability Fund Case Study: Colab Construction

- Colab Construction is an Albany-based commercial and residential building company, operating across the Great Southern.
- Colab were awarded a \$50,000 LCF grant in the 2022/23 funding rounds – they used the funding to update their HSEQ Management System and purchase a Scissor Lift and Truck Crane.
- This LCF funding has helped Colab's competitiveness as a supplier leading to 28 new contracts last year and 2 new staff and an additional apprentice.
- In 2023, Colab Construction were recognised by Department of Finance as an outstanding regional contractor.

Round Overview

- To enhance the capability, capacity and competitiveness of regional based businesses to supplyto Government, export markets or the private business sector.
- \$100,000 in funding reserved for Great Southern businesses 50% of eligible costs up to \$20,000 per business.
- The round closes 3pm AWST, 13 September 2024.

- Being principally based in one of Western Australia's nine regions for at least 12 months;
- Holding an ABN, being registered for GST and being for-profit (or an NFP Aboriginal Corporation); and
- Employing less than 200 people.



Supplying Key Projects Round

Round Overview

- To enhance the capability, capacity and competitiveness of WA businesses supplying projects in the following sectors:
 - Energy Mining Civil Construction Defence Marine
- 50% of eligible costs exc. GST up to \$50,000 per business.
- The round closes 3pm AWST, 13 September 2024.

- Being principally based in Western Australia for at least the next 12 months and have been operating here
 for at least 3 years previously.
- Holding an ABN, being registered for GST and being for-profit.
- Employing less than 200 people.



Aboriginal Business Round

Round Overview

- To enhance the capability, capacity and competitiveness of WA based Aboriginal SMEs.
- 50% of eligible costs exc. GST up to \$50,000 per business.
- The round closes 3pm AWST, 13 September 2024.

- Be an Aboriginal business (at least 50% owned by an Aboriginal interest);
- Registered with either Aboriginal Business Directory or Supply Nation Indigenous Business Direct; and
- Operating in Western Australia for at least 12 months.



Standards Compliance Round

Round Overview

- Funding WA SMEs to carry out the implementation and third-party certification of a wide range of national and international standards, such as:
 - ISO 9001
- ISO 14001
- ISO 27001
- ISO 45001
- 50% of eligible costs exc. GST, up to \$20,000 per business.
- The round closes 3pm AWST, 13 September 2024.

- Being principally based in Western Australia for at least the next 12 months and have been operating here
 for at least 3 years previously.
- Holding an ABN, being registered for GST and being for-profit.
- Employing less than 200 people.

Digital Transformation Round Round Overview



- To support businesses in adopting and using digital technology and data for the purpose of improving productivity, efficiency, competitiveness, resilience and/or safety.
- 50% of eligible costs up to \$25,000 per business.
- The round closes 3pm AWST, 13 September 2024.

- Being principally based in Western Australia for at least the next 12 months and have been operating here
 for at least 3 years previously.
- Holding an ABN, being registered for GST and being for-profit; and
- Have a turnover of at least \$500,000 and a minimum of one FTE employee but less than 200.

Innovation Booster Grants

Overview

- Part of the New Industries Fund \$25.8m State Government Initiative.
- Funding doubled in 2023 80% contribution, now up to \$40,000.
- Ideal applicants are innovation start-ups / innovation-drive SMEs, with a relevant project.
- No longer a reimbursement 75% upfront payment and 25% after project plan acquittal.
- 64 successful recipients in 2024.

- Under 25 employees;
- Projects cannot be retrospective; and
- Innovation must be developed within WA.

- Apprentice Support Bonus (CTF);

Commonwealth Government Incentives for Employers

Priority Hiring Incentive

- For Certificate III or higher, in occupations on the Australian Apprenticeships Priority List
- \$5,000 in the first year of the apprenticeship, paid over two instalments of:
 - \$2,000 at 6 months and \$3,000 at 12 months (full-time)
 - \$1,000 at 6 months and \$1,500 at 12 months (part-time)

Disability Australian Apprentice Wage Support

- Weekly payment to employers who employ apprentices with a disability.
- Eligible employers receive \$104.30 each week for:
 - 12 months if the individual has a long term or permanent disability; and
 - The length of the temporary disability.



Commonwealth Government Incentives for Apprentices/Trainees

Australian Apprentice Training Support Payment:

- Direct financial assistance for those undertaking a Certificate III or higher, in a qualification that is on the Australian Apprenticeships Priority List.
- Eligible apprentices can claim up to four six monthly payments over the first two years of their apprenticeship

New Energy Apprentice Support Payment:

- Available to apprentices undertaking a Certificate III or higher for a qualification that has been identified as a clean energy occupation on the Australian Apprenticeships Priority List
- Eligible apprentices can claim up to \$10,000 for a full time apprenticeship and up to \$5,000 for a part time apprenticeship.

Job Ready Programs

- Connect job seekers with a pathway to work, apprenticeships/traineeships, and further education and training.
- Participants engage in short course training and work placement.
- 1,189 participants employed, many in apprenticeships and traineeships.
- 86% of participants who completed a program have transitioned to employment or further training.

Job Ready Programs

- Currently eight programs being delivered across the Perth Metropolitan area and regional Western Australia:
 - Aged and disability care;
 - Bricklaying;
 - Digital Workplace;
 - Driller's Offsider;
 - Early Childhood Education and Care;
 - Future Chef;
 - Infrastructure (Civil Construction); and
 - Heavy Vehicle Driving Operations.



Construction & Migration Initiatives

Skilled Migrant Employment Register:

• Published details of skilled migrants who are seeking WA employment opportunities.

Skilled Migration Job Connect:

• Program to assist migrants with subsidies for costs of getting skills and qualifications recognised in WA and obtaining relevant licenses / registrations.

Construction Visa Subsidy Program:

 To assist employees and migrants with costs associated with the skilled migration visa pathway.

Designated Area Migration Agreements (DAMA)

Provides access to skilled migrants outside of the standard skilled migration program

Policies

Purchasing Policy

- Policy applies to purchases under \$250,000
- Over \$250,000 mandated by Local Govt Act and Regulations
- Provides for the minimum number of quotes required
- Value for Money principles, Encouraging Effective Competition

Buy Local Policy

- Applies to purchases of \$30,000 or greater
- Prescribed area: Albany, Denmark, Plantagenet, Jerramungup & Gnowangerup
- 10% price reduction for goods & Services, 5% for construction, maximum of \$50,000
- Both Regional Business Preference, and Regional Content Preference given
- Principles of policy can apply to all purchases across the City
