Applications open mid-2024 and will be advertised through the Jobs WA website.

To apply:

You must be Australian citizen, permanent resident or entitled to live and work indefinitely in Australia.

You must have recently completed a university degree in any discipline in the 2023 calendar year or be currently studying one and are due to complete the degree by December 2024.

If successful, you will be required to undertake the Department's police records check process.
