

### Policies and Support for Business



## WA Buy Local Policy 2022 Update released in April 2022

- Ensures the ~\$30 billion spent in State Government contracts creates more work for regional WA businesses.
- Regional Price Preferencing an advantage for local businesses when tendering for work in the regions
  - Regional business preference;
  - Regional content preference.
- 43 key Agencies have now signed Implementation Agreements and are applying WA BLP 2022.

### **Local Content Adviser - Mid West**

### Susannah Ward – Mid West Development Commission

- Each region has a dedicated Local Content Adviser (LCA), based within the Development Commission.
- The Mid West LCA's role is to:
  - Connect Mid West businesses with grant programs.
  - Work with head contractors to create opportunities for local smaller businesses.
  - Help Mid West businesses find government contracting opportunities.



# **Local Capability Fund**

Mid West LCF Applications by Industry



- LCF is aimed at supporting a range of industries/suppliers.
- \$972,000 total funds awarded to 37 Mid West businesses since inception.
- 68% of the applications from the Mid West have been supported.
- Nine Mid West businesses received ~\$190,000 of LCF funding in the 2023/24 FY.

# Local Capability Fund Case Study: Dongara Marine

- Dongara Marine is a Geraldton-based commercial shipbuilding company, operating across the Mid West
- Dongara Marine were awarded a \$50,000 LCF grant in the 2021/22 funding rounds – they used the funding to purchase a single girder overhead crane.
- The crane helped them win 3 new major contracts in the next 12 months – and this work allowing them to bring on 12 new staff and an additional 3 apprentices.
- Since then, Dongara Marine have successfully been awarded 2 more LCF grants – further bolstering their capacity and capability.



# **Regional Business Round**

### **Round Overview**

- To enhance the capability, capacity and competitiveness of regional based businesses to supply to Government, export markets or the private business sector.
- There is specific funding reserved for Mid West businesses 50% of eligible costs up to \$20,000 per business.
- The round closes **3pm AWST**, **13 September 2024**.

### Eligibility

- Being principally based in one of Western Australia's nine regions for at least 12 months;
- Holding an ABN, being registered for GST and being for-profit (or an NFP Aboriginal Corporation); and
- Employing less than 200 people.



### **Innovation Booster Grants** Eligibility

### Overview

- Part of the New Industries Fund \$25.8m State ٠ Government Initiative.
- Funding doubled in 2023 80% contribution, • now up to \$40,000.
- Ideal applicants are innovation start-ups / • **innovation-drive SME**s, with a relevant project.
- No longer a reimbursement 75% upfront • payment and 25% after project plan acquittal.
- 64 successful recipients in 2024. •

# **State Government Incentives for Employers**


- Fee free training for over 130 qualifications.
- Available at all WA TAFE colleges and selected private training providers.

### State Government Employer Incentives:

- Jobs and Skills WA (JSWA) Employer Incentive (DTWD);
- Group Training Wage Subsidy (DTWD); and
- Apprenticeship and Traineeship Grant (CTF).







# **State Government Incentives for Apprentices/Trainees**

- Fee free training for over 130 qualifications.
- Available at all WA TAFE colleges and selected private training providers.

State Government Incentives for Apprentices/Trainees:

- Apprentice Support Bonus (CTF);
- Apprentice Tool Allowance (CTF);
- Travel and Accommodation Allowance (DTWD); and
- Travel and Accommodation Allowance (CTF).



# **Commonwealth Government Incentives** for Employers

### **Priority Hiring Incentive**

- For Certificate III or higher, in occupations on the Australian Apprenticeships Priority List
- \$5,000 in the first year of the apprenticeship/traineeship, paid over two instalments of:
  - \$2,000 at 6 months and \$3,000 at 12 months (full-time)
  - \$1,000 at 6 months and \$1,500 at 12 months (part-time)

### **Disability Australian Apprentice Wage Support (DAAWS)**

- Weekly payment to employers who employ apprentices with a disability.
- Eligible employers receive \$104.30 each week for:
  - 12 months if the individual has a long term or permanent disability; and
  - the length of the temporary disability.



# **Commonwealth Government Incentives for Apprentices/Trainees**

### Australian Apprentice Training Support Payment:

- Direct financial assistance for apprentices/trainees undertaking a Certificate III or higher, in a qualification that is on the Australian Apprenticeships Priority List.
- Eligible apprentices can claim up to four six monthly payments over the first two years of their apprenticeship

### Living Away From Home Allowance (LAHFA)


- Direct financial assistance for apprentices/trainees undertaking a Certificate II or higher.
- Up to \$10,000 for a F/T A&T and up to \$5,000 for a P/T A&T

### New Energy Apprentice Support Payment:

- Available to apprentices undertaking a Certificate III or higher for a qualification that has been identified as a clean energy occupation on the Australian Apprenticeships Priority List
- Eligible apprentices can claim up to \$10,000 for a full time apprenticeship and up to \$5,000 for a part time apprenticeship.

# **Job Ready Programs**

- Connect job seekers with a pathway to work, apprenticeships/traineeships, and further education and training.
- Participants engage in short course training and work placement.
- 1,189 participants employed, many in apprenticeships and traineeships.
- 86% of participants who completed a program have transitioned to employment or further training.



# **Job Ready Programs**

- Currently eight programs being delivered across the Perth Metropolitan area and regional Western Australia:
  - Aged and disability care;
  - Bricklaying;
  - Digital Workplace;
  - Driller's Offsider;
  - Early Childhood Education and Care;
  - Future Chef;
  - Infrastructure (Civil Construction); and
  - Heavy Vehicle Driving Operations.



# **Construction & Migration Initiatives**

### Skilled Migrant Employment Register:

Published details of skilled migrants who are seeking WA employment opportunities.

### **Skilled Migration Job Connect:**

 Program to assist migrants with subsidies for costs of getting skills and qualifications recognised in WA and obtaining relevant licenses / registrations.

### **Construction Visa Subsidy Program:**

 To assist employees and migrants with costs associated with the skilled migration visa pathway.

### **Designated Area Migration Agreement (DAMA)**

Provides access to skilled migrants outside of the standard skilled migration program







# **Construction Visa Subsidy Program**

Supporting WA Building and Construction employers to engage skilled migrants through a visa pathway.

- **\$11 million** in targeted construction visa subsidies.
- Payments of **up to \$10,000** per skilled migrant.
- Commenced 1 July 2023, extended until 30 June 2025.
- Attracting skilled migrants to WA's building and construction sector.

**482** – Temporary Skill Shortage

- 494 Skilled Employer Sponsored (Regional)
- **186** Employer Nomination Scheme



Employers who are headquartered in WA and sponsor skilled migrants to live and work in WA Undertaking commercial and/or residential building and construction work in WA.



Available for eligible building and construction occupations.





Milestone 1 - \$2,000 on registration and agreement to Terms and Conditions. Milestone 2 - \$4,000 when the visa has been granted. Milestone 3 - \$4,000 when the skilled migrant commences work with the WA employer.

Eligibility



VISA SUB-CLASSES

491 – Skilled Work Regional (Provisional) visa
190 – Skilled Nominated visa
Granted through the WA State Nominated Migration Program



Skilled migrants who are living and working in Western Australia Working for an employer who is headquartered in WA and undertaking residential and/or commercial building and construction work

### OFFSHORE migrants:

Milestone 1 - \$5,000 when migrant commences work with WA employer Milestone 2 - \$5,000 after six months

Milestone 1 - \$2,500 when migrant commences work with WA employer Milestone 2 - \$2,500 after six months
