- Establishment of the LEAG and Terms of Reference endorsed Cabinet on 15 July 2024

- Up to 12 members, including a Chairperson and 11 members
- Individuals with the lived experience of family and domestic violence
- Appropriate representation of the diverse experiences of family and domestic violence and WA's diverse population

Ruah Centre for Women and Children (RCWC)



29 Shenton Street is a seven story, state of the art, purpose-built facility for women and children.

Across the 7 floors, it contains the Karlup Service, administration floors and safe accommodation.







Karlup service is situated over 2 levels of the building.

Karlup is an integrated recovery and healing service which provides women and children with a comprehensive suite of offerings including:

- Koorta Guides
- Counsellors
- Peer Support
- Financial Counsellor
- Medical Practice
- Dentistry
- Legal Support
- AOD Support
- Housing Support
- Recovery and Healing Programs

Karlup was named using the Noongar word, 'Karlup', meaning the place of my home, the place where my campfire is, where I am staying.

Referral Criteria





Client identifies as a woman

Client is currently safe / not in immediate risk of harm

Client is affected by FDV

Client does NOT require emergency accommodation

Client is 18 or older

Pathways





Referrals in

- Self-referral
- o Referral from another service
- Telephone the Karlup ServiceWalk-in to the Karlup Service

Referrals Out

- Connections to local services
- o Connections to specialist services and expertise

Safe Accommodation

o Freeing up crisis accommodation
