A Management Plan is a plan that pastoral lessees may voluntarily establish, or that the Pastoral Lands Board (PLB) may direct a lessee to submit under section 108A of the *Land Administration Act 1997*.

The purpose of a Management Plan is to document the management decisions a lessee intends to make in order to manage the land under their lease to its best pastoral advantage.

If the PLB has directed the lessee to submit a Management Plan, that plan must demonstrate how a pastoral lessee will address the PLB's direction(s) to make improvements to the land under the lease.

This template provides a guide on what is expected of a pastoral lessee when submitting a Management Plan. Please complete all fields/boxes.


