Fish Resources Management Act 1994

PROHIBITION ON FISHING (WIRE TRACE) ORDER 2024

[AS30759]

Made by the Minister under section 43.

1. Citation

This order is the Prohibition on Fishing (Wire Trace) Order 2024.

2. Commencement

This order commences operation on 1 October 2024.

3. Order revoked

The Prohibition on Fishing (Wire Trace) Order 2022 is revoked.

4. Interpretation

In this order -

wire trace means a length of steel or metal wire or chain that is attached to, or is part of, a fishing line, but does not include hooks, swivels, or sinkers.

5. Prohibition

A person must not fish in the areas described in Schedules 1, 2 and 3 by the use of a wire trace.

Schedule 1 – Metropolitan waters

All Western Australian waters extending 800 metres seaward of the high-water mark on the mainland between 31° 27.314' south latitude and 32° 40.088' south latitude; the waters of the Dawesville Channel up to the Port Bouvard bridge (excluding tributaries); the waters of the Mandurah Estuary up to the Mandurah Estuary Bridge (excluding tributaries); and the waters of the Swan and Canning Rivers (including tributaries).

Schedule 2 – Busselton Jetty

All Western Australian waters extending 800 metres seaward of the high-water mark on the mainland between a point at 33° 38.521' south latitude and 115° 21.259' east longitude (north of the northern end of Georgette St) and a point at 33° 39.339' south latitude and 115° 18.563' east longitude (at the Vasse River Diversion Drain); and all waters within 400m of the Busselton Jetty.

Schedule 3 – Esperance Jetty

All Western Australian waters within 200m of either side of the Esperance Jetty; then extending 800 metres seaward of the high-water mark on the mainland.
