Assessment against the Bushfire protection criteria

For each element listed in Appendix 4 of the *Guidelines for Planning in Bushfire Prone Areas* (Guidelines), the 'intent' must be demonstrated by addressing the relevant acceptable solutions. Where these acceptable solutions cannot be <u>fully</u> achieved within the boundary of the development site, evidence must be provided demonstrating to the fullest extent possible how the bushfire criteria have been addressed and provide justification for those criteria that have not been met. The decision-maker may also consider that the BMP template for a 'simple' DA may not be sufficient in addressing the bushfire protection criteria and the BMP template for a 'complex' Development Application (DA) should be used.

Preparations Just Prior and During the Bushfire Season Checklist

Bushfire season: (date/month) / to /
Actions
Ongoing
Make sure that staff and visitors know what to do in a bushfire emergency
Keep property access clear and easily trafficable
Just prior and during the bushfire season
Review Bushfire Emergency Evacuation Plan to ensure details, procedures and contact phone numbers are correct
Prepare firebreaks in compliance with the local government's firebreak notice
Develop and maintain asset protection zone
Place current version of site layout on premise in visible locations
Provide an emergency water supply
Tree pruning – remove lower branches, check that powerlines are clear
Move woodpile and stacked timber away from the building
Trim lawns and grassed areas to be kept below 100mm in height
Prune the dead material from the shrubs in the asset protection zone
Clear roof and gutters from leaf litter and debris
Prepare an emergency evacuation kit and place in easily accessible area
Check first aid kits, fire extinguishers, emergency lighting etc. are current, serviceable and accessible
Water lawns trees and shrubs near the building

Triggers to Evacuate

- Advice, Watch and Act or Emergency Warning alert from the Department of Fire and Emergency Services
- Direction to evacuate from an emergency service authority
- Higher fire danger ratings may also be used
